

1 By moving the axis foreward on the bass side of the guitar, the arm position is more ergonomic and relaxed. You get the feeling of a 16inch

guitar while actuallyplaying a 17inch. Huge sound – tight feel!

2 By moving the axis backward on the treble side, the cutaway is deeper than on a normal jazz guitar. Easy access to the highest notes.

3 The F-holes are designed to produce a modern, full and open sound, but still keeping plenty of the fullbodied warm jazz sound.



- 4 A one-piece, full contact bridge for powerful string-to-top transmission adds clarity and punch (a second adjustable bridge is also included).
- 5 The tailpiece is attached with the finest available material. The 'velvet tailpiece chord', although costly, it is the fastest sound transmitting high-tech material available.
 - 6 The output jack is mounted into the tail-block. Side mounted outputs can easy break the sides.7 The elegant finger rest differs from traditional

finger rests. It is smaller at the bridgeside and

- allows access to the volume and tone control without leaving the playing position. Because the knobs are mounted underneath, you will not alter the controls by accident.
- **8** For perfect tonal balance we selected a Kent Armstrong pick up with adjustable pole pieces.
- **9** Luxurious and effortless Schertler tuners reduce weight at the headstock resulting in optimal instrument balance.

Because this guitar is made out of high quality solid tonewoods, a few care tips will prolong the life of your guitar dramatically.

Please oil the fingerboard twice a year, once in fall and once in spring. Do not expose your guitar to direct sunlight or store it near a heater. Try to keep humidity constant around 50%. Clean the guitar with a good guitar polish. Change the strings often and don't forget that you also may have a partner with needs:-)
